



Engineering Group Student Fund Award

The Engineering Group Engineering Geology Fund is available to all members of the Geological Society of at least one year's standing as a Fellow to support activities associated with Engineering Geology. This may include any activities to assist with your education (research activities, books, training courses, equipment as well as conference/fieldtrip attendance). Priority will be given to those with limited alternative sources of funding as well as to those involved EGGS-sponsored activities. Grants are normally for sums up to £500.

Applications can be submitted at any time but are reviewed twice a year. Applications should be made using the official application form and sent to the Secretary of EGGS by the deadline dates stipulated. Please ensure that anticipated budgets are complete and, where appropriate, identify the source(s) of financing, e.g. EGGS, Employer, external source/Department/Institution (give details), personal funds, etc..

Successful applicants will be required to provide a brief statement of expenditure and activities undertaken within 3 months after the event has taken place.

Deadlines: 15th November and 15th May

General rules and procedures

1. No more than one grant will be awarded to an individual Geological Society member in any one calendar year (see also note 6 below).
2. Applications will be considered by an Awards Panel drawn from the EGGS Committee, normally consisting of at least three Officers and one Ordinary Member.
3. Results of each grant round will normally be available within 1 month of the deadline. Successful applicants will be notified in writing with full details of the awards made published on our website.
4. EGGS will not consider retrospective applications, i.e. to support activities that will already have occurred prior the deadline date. Furthermore, and to encourage well-planned and properly budgeted projects, EGGS will not consider applications for activities that will take place within 2 months of the deadline date.
5. Successful applicants must submit a short written report (suitable for publication) and/or a statement of expenditure, by a specified deadline (but within 3 months of the attending the conference).
6. No further applications from an individual will be considered until 12 months have elapsed from the time of receipt of written reports and/or statements of expenditure.
7. The financial support from EGGS should be acknowledged in any publication, poster or presentation arising from funded activities.
8. 'Student' is defined as someone undertaking studies as either an apprentice, graduate or post graduate. A supporting statement by your Supervisor is required by to validate the application
